

We are beginning to create some plant displays that will be accessible to both our residents in wheelchairs and those that can move around freely. These will encourage the use of all of the senses.











Message from the Trustees

It's such a blessing in Spring to see new life. So many joys that come from seeing new buds, flowers, leaves and a freshness in the air before the HK summer humidity sets in.

The last quarter has been especially challenging for all in HK and for us as the HOLF family. Residents stuck at home. Visitors not permitted. News of war and pestilence that continues to stress. A shortage of staff here at HOLF and for many homes as we all struggle to retain or recruit people needed to care for our and their special residents.

However, there have also been joys and miracles.

Over a month ago one of our residents needed to go to hospital for a particular medical procedure. Waiting in the hospital for four or five hours before being seen then resulted in a positive Covid result for her and a staff member who went with her. The resident was immediately isolated. The staff member sent home to self-isolate.

What a blessing the following day to find that our resident tested negative and could be sent home! Hallelujah! This was so amazing and such an answer to prayer as the resident concerned cannot speak and would have been quite terrified to be isolated for such a long period of time in hospital.

The staff member who had tested negative that morning (as everyone did before going to hospital with our resident that day) remained positive for about a week and then able to return to work. We are so grateful to her for her patience in enduring the uncertainties which befall those who test positive. This is a great fear for so many.

Thankfully, our residents have so far remained safe and without Covid. This has not been the case for so many homes for the elderly and disabled where, as you will have read, many have lost their lives and in such difficult circumstances away from family.

Meanwhile, we give thanks to God for our staff who have been working phenomenally hard and with no respite. We give special thanks for our lead social worker, Alan, who will be leaving us later in April as he and the family relocate to England. Alan has blessed us in so many ways with his dedication in creating individual care plans for each resident, preparing newsletters like this, helping to be a home manager and caring for our residents and staff. Please join us in wishing him every blessing as he and family move overseas.

We are also most grateful to you all for your continued support. Your messages of encouragement really help us as we battle through each day not knowing what the day will bring. Thankfully, we know that whatever happens we have a loving Lord who walks with us, guides us and encourages us.

This is also the season of Lent as we prepare for Easter and turn our eyes to the journey that Jesus took... a stressful journey of faithful obedience...even to death on the cross. A painful and humiliating death. Thankfully, there is hope and joy that comes knowing that we can celebrate the risen Lord at Easter and forever.

We therefore take this opportunity to wish you a happy Easter and the blessing of His resurrection power which brings encouragement and hope as we trust that somehow God will bring us through these challenging times. Over Easter, we hope that you find opportunities to rest, to exercise, to keep an attitude of gratitude and focus on the beauty of God's creation as we celebrate new life and His risen life and an eternal life with Him.
